Daily Evacuation Updates Summary

Las Vegas – We want to remind all residents in San Miguel and Mora counties, as evacuation levels change and your residence becomes deemed an area of evacuation, we encourage you to take immediate action. This is a long-term event.

Community Evacuation Status in San Miguel and Mora Counties

GO (Mandatory Full Evacuation, Colored Green):

San Miguel County

The communities of Mineral Hill, San Pablo, San Geronimo, Ojitos Frios, Rociada, Upper Rociada are still in GO STATUS.

Mora County

The communities of Chacon, El Turquillo, Los Cisneros, Lucero, & Rainsville, Guadalupita North, Guadalupita South, Holman West, Los Hueros, Los Lefebres, & Naranjos, North Mora, Ojo Feliz and Apache Lake, Sierra Bonita, and South Mora are currently under GO STATUS.

SET (Prepare for Evacuation, Colored Yellow):

San Miguel County

The communities of 527-525 Hwy 518, Big Pine, Bull Canyon, Canoncito, Canovas Canyon, Chavez, Country Acres, County A3, Cow Creek, Upper & Lower Colonias, D Bibb East, D Bibb West, E Las Tusas, E Sapello, El Porvenir, Emplazado, Gallinas, Gunner Trail, Hot Springs, La Canada, Las Dispensas, Lone Pine Mesa, Lower Canyon Road, Manuelitas, Pendaries Valley East, Pendaries Village, Porvenir Canyon, Romeroville West, San Ignacio, Storrie Lake, Taylor Wells, Tierra Monte – Canon, Trout Springs, W Las Tusas, and W Sapello are currently under SET STATUS.

Mora County

The Communities of Abuelo, Buena Vista, Golondrinas, Ledoux, Penasco Blanco, Puertocito, Rito Cebolla, Santiago Creek, South Carmen, Upper Morphy, Watrous/ Fort Union are currently under SET STATUS.

READY (Prepare for Possible Evacuation, Colored Red):

San Miguel County

The communities of Camp Luna, Cinder Road, Crestone, NMBHI, and Romeroville East are currently in READY STATUS.

Mora County

No Communities are currently under READY STATUS.

San Miguel Shelter site for horses and livestock: The Zamora arena continues to be utilized to temporarily house evacuated horses and livestock. The contact for livestock and horses is Matthew Romero, Livestock Inspector, 575-643-6805. The Pecos arena is also available for sheltering livestock. That contact is Freddy Lujan, Pecos Sheriff's Posse at either 505-930-3986 or 505-757-3986.

Mora Shelter Site for Horses and Livestock: The Taos County Sheriff's Posse Rodeo Grounds is being utilized for livestock. Call Livestock Inspector Ruben Baca at 575-770-1490.

If you are keeping livestock at these locations, please make arrangements to ensure your animals are fed and watered.

ROAD CLOSURES

San Miguel County:

N.M. 94 is closed at mile post 18 (Restricting access to Mora). N.M. 105 is closed at mile post 4. N.M. 276 is closed at mile post 0, N.M. 283 is closed between mile posts 1 (San Miguel Detention Center) and 15. N.M. 65 will be closed at mile post 15. CR A4A is being restricted at the junction of CR A4A and A34.

Mora County:

N.M. 518 is closed between mile posts 26 (La Cueva) and 52 (Sipapu). N.M. 518 is restricted from CR A011 due to wildfire, N.M. 434 is closed at mile post 26 (Black Lake), N.M. 94 is closed at mile post 17.5 (Restricting access to Mora), N.M. 442 is closed at mile post 21 (Ocate), N.M. 120 at mile post 17.2 (junction of N.M. 120 & N.M. 442) is closed. N.M. 121 is closed between mile posts 0 and 8.
